From Your Police Department: Welcome to July!

We certainly hope everyone and their families will get out and enjoy the summer weather. This is the time of the year that we see an uptick in people going out of town with their families on vacation. Please be sure to let the police department know you will be away so we can keep a close eye on your home while you are gone.

As has been reported, but is very important to repeat, Village Council unanimously has opted out of HB 172. What that simply means is that Gates Mills has retained our ban on fireworks, thus making it illegal to privately shoot off fireworks in the village. We are asking for voluntary compliance, so our officers are not put in a compromising position of having to issue a citation for the illegal use of fireworks to a resident which requires a court appearance. As you know, when a complaint is received, the officers have a duty to respond and investigate the matter. Ohio's fireworks laws are written to protect people and promote safety. Failing to comply with these laws can result in devastating fires and catastrophic personal injuries. Enjoy your Fourth of July celebration, but leave the fireworks displays to the licensed professionals.

By now, residents should have received an informational mailing on our Mayfield Road Speed Enforcement Program. If you did not receive one, please let us know and we will get one to you. If you have any additional questions, feel free to contact me or Sergeant Michael Day at the Town Hall. We are projecting our 30-day warning period to begin around July 5th in which violators will receive a warning letter in the mail. Actual enforcement will begin 30 days later, around August 5th. It should be noted that we have been collecting data for the last 45 days from the eastbound camera, and there has already been a measurable reduction in the number of excessive violators. The program is already working. Our goal is to make Mayfield Road as safe as possible.

In early August, Ptl. Jessica Newsome will have completed her 4th year in the Village. Congratulations to Jessica!

The Carillon at St. Christopher's by-the-River Church

Abbreviated excerpt by David Osburn, Carilloneur of St. Paul's and St. Christopher's, in *In Our Own Voices*, pp 84-90. Available from the Gates Mills Historical Society.

Every year the pre-parade Carillon Concert is heard all over the Village from 10:15 to 10:45 AM

Though built in 1853, the iconic New England style church belfry never had a bell in it until 1899. The church was Methodist, and it was part of the Mayfield Circuit that included three churches—one at Mayfield Center (S.O.M. and Wilson Mills), the Gates Mills church, and one in the Chesterland area. The first bell in Gates Mills came in 1899 when the Cleveland & Eastern Traction company paid the Gates Mills church for a right-of-way going past the church for its track.

In 1927, Virginia Saunders White, the wife of Walter C. White, was instrumental in the conversion of St. Christopher's from its Methodist origins to Episcopal. An Episcopal group had been meeting informally in the building for vespers. Because of the original deed, the ownership of the church property reverted to the multiple heirs of Holsey Gates each of whom had to be found to approve the transfer of ownership. The church was to be named St. Christopher's, and the story is that Virginia White was determined to have "by-the-River" be part of the official name.

It was right at this time in the 1920's, that **carillons** in America began to be installed. They had long been popular in the "low countries" of Europe, but the first carillon in the states was in 1922 in Gloucester, Massachusetts. "Carillons" are confused with "chimes" and while each consists of bells in a tower, a carillon has at least 23 finely tuned bells and a well-adjusted keyboard played with the hands formed into slightly clenched fists. "Chimes," on the other hand, are usually 8-12 bells, not always well tuned, and while the country had hundreds of chimes, the advent of carillons in this country meant that when a chime was installed by a carillon maker, they were very high-quality bells.

There were only two bellfounders at that time of any consequence, and one of them, Gillett & Johnston of Croydon, England was chosen by Sarita Oglebay Burton Russell to install an eight-bell chime in St. Christopher by-the-River commemorating its new life as an Episcopal Church. Gillett & Johnston was also the choice of John D. Rockefeller Jr. who is not, but should be, famous for building two of the largest and finest carillons in the world in New York (Riverside Church) and Chicago (Rockefeller Chapel)....Sarita and Courtney Burton Sr. were the parents of Courtney Burton, Jr., long a famous Gates Mills resident and one-time mayor.

The new eight bell chime at St. Christopher's meant the removal of the 1899 bell, and it was placed in a kind of "shrine" at the edge of the river bank that had been hand hewn from lumber by one of the most memorable of all Gates Mills residents, George Brown. At a later time, that bell was given to the Mayfield Center Methodist church (S.O.M. and Wilson Mills), a fitting gift since the two churches had long shared the touring Methodist preachers of the Mayfield Circuit, and the bell, even when in the Gates Mills tower, had always been a "Methodist Bell."

In the mid 1960s, the eight bells were augmented to a 23-bell carillon following a special fundraising effort. The playing console for the original set of eight bells is in the custody of Peter

Griesinger whose father was significant in promoting the enlargement of the 8 bell chime to a 23-bell carillon.

A different British bellfounder did that work because Gillett & Johnston had closed. It was a remarkable achievement to install that many bells in such a small tower space. Two plans made it possible. The pitch of the carillon is high so the bells (and resulting weight) are smaller than normal in a carillon, and since even a small carillon is still much heavier than anything planned when the church was built in 1853, pylons were sunk into the earth to support the tower and the bell frame holding the bells. It was a major project! My understanding is that those strengthening pylons also made possible another heavy addition to St. Christopher's in 2000—a baroque pipe organ in the choir loft, that could never have even been imagined by Holsey Gates. A special plaque on the wall of the stairs to the choir loft gives the names of the donors of the carillon enlargement.

There are only 165 carillons in the entire country. Ohio has ten, so St. Christopher's can be considered very special because it has such a fine, small carillon that can be played in perfectly peaceful surroundings.

After the **carillon** was installed, special concert performances on the carillon were scheduled to precede the annual Independence Day parade. This tradition has been a feature of parade day for more than fifty years. Most of the earlier ones were played by Frank Griesinger and by visiting carillonneurs from time to time. I, David Osburn, carillonneur at St. Paul's in Cleveland Heights and frequent performer on the McGaffin Carillon at Church of the Covenant in University Circle, have played these pre-parade concerts for more than 30 years. I had started playing the St. Christopher's bells in 1957, when it was only an eight-bell chime.

The carillon is also played for the annual Blessing of the Hunt when horses, riders and hounds from the Chagrin Valley Hunt Club gather with clergy on the grounds of the church ("John Peel" is always played for the Blessing of the Hunt).

Finally, carillons are very special but often misunderstood. People never see the person playing them. More people think they are automated and the sound comes from speakers than realize they are being played by a person. They are further confused with "change ringing." That is the famous method of ringing church bells in thousands of places in England where the bells are rung in what seems like a random pattern but is actually a carefully worked out mathematical series so the bells are rung in an ever-changing pattern each one different than the other. Change ringing bells are operated by ropes, not a keyboard like the ones above.

The bottom line for Gates Mills and St. Christopher's Church is that the church has a beautiful, properly small, carillon capable of fine music—complicated and not complicated—but the bells are excellent and the setting is sublime.

About the Speakers



Dr. Larick will summarize the geological evolution of the Chagrin Valley, focusing on the advance and retreat of the last glacier, 23,000 to 11,000 years ago. He will also address the evolution of the native forest as represented by the 296 Moses Cleaveland Trees designated in Cuyahoga County, 1946-1986.

Roy Larick, Ph.D., Paleolithic Archaeologist, Bluestone Conservation

Roy Larick has work on four continents, and brings an archaeological perspective for comprehending local lands and waters. In 2009, he founded Bluestone Conservation to advocate for Cleveland's small watersheds and landforms. In 2014, Bluestone joined the Central Lake Erie Basin watershed organizations working to restore natural areas. In 2017, Bluestone became a Watershed Partner with the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District to restore buried stream features. Dr. Larick has led an inventory and archive of the Moses Cleaveland Trees for the Early Settlers Association of the Western Reserve, which provides a window onto the native forest of Cuyahoga County during the late 1700s.



Chad Clink will focus on tree care, best practices and threats to our urban forest. Specific focus on good arboriculture and scientific research to support pest and disease management towards long term tree preservation.

Chadwick Clink, Manager & Commercial Arborist - Bartlett Tree Experts

Chad has an Associate and Bachelor's degree in Horticulture; and a Master's degree in Natural Resource Management from the University of Idaho. He has worked across the country as an arborist and urban forester. Chad's interests are in arboriculture and urban forestry, with special interest in the tree care industry. He is a Board-Certified Master Arborist, Registered Consulting Arborist, Municipal Specialist, Tree Risk Assessment Qualified with the ISA, and a Licensed Commercial Applicator with the Ohio Department of Agriculture.



Kimberly will discuss how communities, partners, and landowners can work together to protect the Chagrin River Watershed – including best management practices that can be taken at the individual landowner level or at the community level.

Kimberly Brewster Shefelton, Deputy Director, Chagrin River Watershed Partners

Kimberly has a Master of Science in Environmental Studies from Ohio University. Kimberly works with communities and the Central Lake Erie Basin watershed partners on watershed protection, stormwater management, restoration projects, project development, habitat assessments, watershed plan development, grant writing, and assisting communities with incorporating natural resource protections into their codes. Kim has written or assisted with successful grants awarded to CRWP. Kimberly's work is published in the journal of Environmental Earth Sciences.

Village Bulletin Board

Septic Inspection

Heather Grisez, from the Cuyahoga County Board of Health asked if we could put this in the upcoming Pink Sheet. It is on the Village website, and is good information for those looking to sell their house.

Remember to plan ahead with the sale of your home. Preparation is key to provide a smooth sale transition. Gates Mills does require a septic point of sale for transfer of property per village ordinance.

The Cuyahoga County Board of Health regulates Ohio's household sewage program. An application and payment of \$350 is necessary to schedule an inspection. Your house must be occupied at time of inspection and for the last 30 days and the septic tank may not be pumped out in the last 30 days. If the house is not occupied, the title may transfer and the inspection completed once it has been occupied for 30 days with the new homeowner. Escrow is not required in Gates Mills or per the Board of Health but is often used. Please refer any specific questions regarding your property to Healther Grisez at the Cuyahoga County Board of Health, 216-201-2001 Ext. 1231.






