Our green trees have turned to beautiful shades of Fall reds and oranges. Autumn is here as is **Daylight Savings Time**. Make sure to change your clocks on Nov. 5<sup>th</sup> when we fall back an hour.

Please remember that Tuesday **November 7**<sup>th</sup> is **Election Day.** We have 5 candidates running for 3 seats on Council. I encourage each of you to do your homework on all the candidates to make as educated a decision as possible. Bios and platforms on all candidates are available at the Town Hall and on the Village website. You can gain further insight into the 3 incumbents by watching videos of all the Council meetings that are also on the website. **Please vote!** 

October was a very busy month. Events for recycling televisions, electronics, and hazardous waste were held. We also offered shredding services. It was indeed a productive month for helping our environment! I want to thank the many helpers that have picked up roadside trash as they enjoy their daily walks with their dogs. We can all be very proud of how attractive our community is.

Thank you to everyone who helped with and attended our **Annual Halloween Party** on October 27<sup>th</sup>. It was a great event with lots of costumes, fun things and goblins!

We are having our third "Holiday Decorating Contest". Prizes will be awarded in several categories with pictures taken. We encourage you to enter. A registration form is in the Pink Sheet, or you can call Jean or Dorothy at Town Hall (440-423-4405) to register. Registration will run through December 20<sup>th</sup> with judging to follow. Also, Jennifer Pinto will have Lights for Lions boxes out in Town Hall to collect broken holiday lights. It's part of the Cleveland Metroparks Zoo's Lights for Lions Initiative. The lights that are collected are recycled for a profit which is provided to conservation partners Ruaha Carnivore Project and Lion Landscapes.

Please check that your house numbers are visible from the street in **BOTH DIRECTIONS.** Some houses have no numbers or only one side, yet emergency vehicles need visibility from both sides in case of an emergency at your location.

Gates Mills is extremely proud to be a part of the Mayfield City Schools. Mayfield is one of the largest and most diverse among the 13 districts in the county that earned a 5 star rating. Gates Mills Elementary was in the top 2% among 2000 elementary schools in the state of Ohio. Only 4 schools out of 164 received a 5 star rating and 2 were ours—Center and Gates Mills Schools!

I want to bring you up to date on our traffic cameras on Mayfield Road which have received a great deal of press, some not very accurate. It took over 1½ years to get everything up and running. The primary goal was to slow down traffic and avoid accidents in a very dangerous area...and so far, so good. Pre-Covid Mayfield Road had 18,000 cars per day. That number has dropped to 15,000-16,000. Our cameras went online 8/17 along with warning signs at all Village entrances. On day one over 400 cars were going over 60MPH in a 45MPH zone. Now speeders account for about 125 cars per day—a huge improvement. The signs at all entrances to the Village have also slowed down traffic on side streets. After an initial grace period, citations were sent out for speeding over 60MPH. The highest speed being 91MPH. There are 8 other local communities with cameras, and in comparison, we are issuing fewer citations and lower fines. Drivers are slowing down. There are 3 tiers of fines: 80% are for speeds from 60-64MPH, 15% for speeds 65-74MPH and 55% for speeds above 75MPH.

Finally I want to wish all of you and your families a Very Happy Thanksgiving. I am thankful for all the community support in the Village and for the beautiful Village we call home.

We have officially turned the calendar to Autumn which brings its own set of hazards. Do not make the mistake of thinking that this is an easy time for driving. Typically, this time of year has the highest number of traffic accidents based on miles driven. An increase in traffic accidents is in large part due to deer. Autumn marks the beginning of deer breeding season. They can often be seen near the edge of the road. Keep a sharp eye out for deer crossings, and remember that deer are most active around sunrise and sunset. Also, rain during the season combined with fallen leaves can make roadways slippery. Leave additional distance between cars when it is raining to ensure adequate time for braking.

Unfortunately, once again, we have seen an increase in fraud reports filed by our residents. As a result, On Wednesday, November 15<sup>th</sup> from 6:00 – 7:30 p.m. at the community house, we will be hosting a Fraud Seminar. Our presenter will be Cleveland FBI Supervisory Special Agent Pat Koeth, of the white-collar crime squad unit. Special Agent Koeth will speak about Elder Fraud, current scams, ways to protect your passwords, etc. He will also talk about the IC3 (Internet Crime Complaint Center). Please plan on attending this important informational seminar.

No matter what type of disaster strikes our town there is a high probability that electrical power may be interrupted. These interruptions usually last only a few hours. However, we have experienced interruptions for many days. Although the area affected may be large it is always a good idea to report the outage to the power company. This will help the power company to make a more efficient assessment to allocate resources in a timely manner.

Your disaster plan should include preparations for power interruptions. This might include flashlights, battery-operated smoke detectors, carbon monoxide detectors, and other battery backups to maintain internet and internet phone service. Other backup systems include stationary generators, portable generators, or solar backup systems.

Stationary generators are usually sized to operate an entire household and run off of the natural gas or propane that is used to heat your home. When having these units installed, give special attention so that engine exhaust is directed away from the house. These systems usually have an automatic transfer switching system that turns on the emergency power when the normal power is interrupted and switches the power back when the normal power is restored.

Portable generators are usually used to run individual circuits in the home that are necessary for emergency operations. These include furnaces, lighting, refrigerators, etc., and usually, must be set up manually. When using this equipment NEVER run it in your house or garage. The generator must be set up outside and any extension cords used must be of the heavy-duty type to carry the rated electrical load. Also, never refuel a running generator, shut it down and let it cool.

Always have your carbon monoxide detector working in your home when using both stationary and portable generating equipment, it is your safeguard.

The last backup system is a solar panel system with a battery storage bank. This system relies on the sun's energy to recharge the battery storage bank.

In summary, plan to use all systems as safely as possible.

### The Bridge

Written by Sterling W. Hubbard, Jr. on the occasion of its restoration, October, 1980

The third and last in a series of articles on the Walking Bridge in the Village

I left and went over to the bridge once more before starting up the east hill and home. I was in time to see the six geese fly off over the high girders. I was thinking of another dash across the valley and thunder over the bridge. An episode to which Sam never alluded to although his memory was excellent. This was the case of the early morning, backward riding, newspaper reading lone passenger.

It seems that the "Bankers Express" was well up the west hill that morning when the power failed and it slowed to a stop. The motorman set the brakes and he and the conductor climbed down onto the tracks to see if the trolley was off the wire or if there was some other malfunction of the car. They could find nothing wrong, so they strolled off a short distance for a smoke and waited for the power to come back on. Hearing a slight rumble they turned in time to see their morning express start off backward down the hill with its single passenger absorbed in his morning

paper. The air had leaked out of the brakes. Down the hill raced the car with the motorman and conductor in hot pursuit.

After a series of passes over the bridge and several crossings of the polo field, the Bankers Express gave up near the Maple Leaf Inn at stop twenty-one were the library now stands. [The Southwick House Museum served as the Village library in 1980.] The panting crew rejoined it there as the passenger climbed down folding his newspaper. He consulted his watch and addressed the conductor. "What are we doing here, Sam?"



### Fall in love with Trees!

Fall has arrived! The leaves are changing color and stores are selling pumpkin spice everything! For many of us, the season is defined by falling leaves, and the task of cleaning up after them. Did you know that a medium-sized tree can capture as much as 2,300 gallons of rainfall every year! Fall is also a great time to plant trees and shrubs. Read on to learn how trees can help keep local water bodies and learn how to plant a tree in your yard this season!

### Why Plant a tree in the fall?



There are many benefits to planting trees or shrubs in the fall. The cooler temperatures and autumn rain help trees to establish their roots because roots grow best in cool soil. Fall rain and cooler temperatures mean less watering than in spring because of warmer temperatures. This allows the trees to handle drought and heat of summer months.

### **Proper Tree Planting Techniques**

Still worried about your tree not making it? There are things to do to ensure your tree has the best chance possible to grow strong and healthy! The top four reasons why trees do not survive are:

- The hole that the tree was planted in was too small.
- The hole was too deep.
- The root ball was not loosened when planting.
- Curious deer

All four are preventable. After a tree is planted it is best to protect it from deer. Male deer can easily kill a young tree via buck rub, when a male deer rubs his antlers against the base of the tree, to mark it with his scent. It is important to use either a trunk guard or caging for the first few years of growing. Caging also protects against lawn maintenance.



### Trees, Stormwater, and Other Benefits

Did you know that tree roots promote infiltration of stormwater into soil, which leads to less water ponding on your lawn and reduces stormwater flowing into storm sewer systems and downstream areas! Infiltration helps replenish groundwater supply, which many streams in the Chagrin River Watershed are fed by. Roots also help stabilize the soil and landscape. Trees can also help increase property value, provide habitat for wildlife, reduce local temperatures in the summer, improve air quality, and add aesthetic & recreational value.

Note for National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Stormwater Phase II Communities:



CRWP can provide annual walk-throughs of municipal facilities and provide recommendations for implementing Minimum Control Measures (MCMs) to assist with meeting permit requirements. CRWP can assist with compliance with Storm Water Management Plan (SWMP) implementation and NPDES permit requirements. CRWP has developed a virtual staff training on Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping for our members' use which can be used to meet the member's annual MCM6 requirement. ### **Meet Mayfield High School**

As our local public school children complete Mayfield Middle School, the next stop is the **Mayfield High School** serving 1,350+ students in grades nine to 12. Continuing our series of school profiles at the beginning of the 2023-2024 school year, we wanted to share a few ABC-oriented data points on the things to love about our Mayfield High School!

**Advanced Placement** – One of the benefits of a high school the size of Mayfield is expanded course offerings. The school offers 28 AP courses, which is among the most in Cuyahoga County. AP courses across six departments provide students the opportunity to take college level courses and earn college credits and/or advanced placement for their performance on year-end exams. Last year the College Board celebrated 115 Wildcats as AP Scholars in recognition of their achievement on multiple AP exams, including 19 AP Scholars with Honors and 52 AP Scholars with Distinction.

**Bears and Benefitting Others** – From the annual Teddy Bear Clinic–where Excel TECC Medical Technology students visit with kindergarteners and their teddy bears to share healthy habits and build a sense of comfort in medical settings–to a weeklong immersive service experience working with homeless individuals, among other projects, Mayfield Wildcats contribute to our community.

**Culture of Innovation** – The faculty (78.9% of which have at least a master's degree), fosters a culture of innovation by implementing leading evidence-based learning approaches. The high school has been recognized by state and national associations for providing a rich educational experience complete with options for scholars of varying interests and aptitudes, including self-directed learning, connections to high-impact internships, and an exciting innovation center providing hands-on learning opportunities. Students engage with cross-curricular project-based learning, capstone projects and other applied settings to use their creativity, collaborate, and grow their problem-solving, critical thinking, and communication skills so they are prepared for life post-graduation.

**Diversity** – The school enjoys a diverse community comprised of students that identify as Asian or Pacific Islander (6.5%), Black (20.7%), Hispanic (4.5%), Multiracial (5.2%) and White (63%).

**Excellence** – Students in Mayfield High School demonstrate excellence across a variety of disciplines. The Wildcats placed sixth in the Ohio Science Olympiad. The theatre department's production of *Ragtime* won the Best Musical at the Dazzle Awards, which celebrate arts education within the Northeast Ohio community. A team of Excel TECC students were State champions in the Skills USA competition and qualified for the National Championship. A small sample of other individual achievements includes: 15 students being honored at the Scholastic Writing and Art competition; three students being named National Merit Finalists and seven being named National Commended Scholars; and one student scoring a perfect 36 on the ACT and being honored as a U.S. Presidential Scholar (one of only three such students in Ohio and 161 nationally).
