

Dear Villagers,

Each April, talented residents and art connoisseurs of Northeast Ohio look forward to the annual Gates Mills Art Show at the Community House. The Art Show was founded in 1971 to encourage and promote the diverse aesthetics and ideals reflected in the artistic works of the residents in Gates Mills and the nearby communities. Longtime residents will recognize the two graphics on this page as the traditional symbols of the Art Show.



Seasoned village resident, Mo Novello, along with other members of the former Gates Mills Film Society, came up with the idea of displaying original art as an additional cultural offering to fill the time between reel changes during the Film Society's Sunday night movie presentations at The Community House. Over the years the Art Show has built an impressive reputation based on the professional caliber of the panel judging the competition and the distinguished artists who compete.

Entries must be original works completed by the artist within the past two years and may include paintings, drawings, graphic prints, photographs and sculpture. Eligible artists must be 18 or older and be residents of Northeast Ohio.



Artist Entry forms were mailed to returning artists in March. New resident artists may find Artist Entry forms on the village website. Look on the dropdown menu for Recreation. Additionally extra entry forms are also available at Gates Mills Town Hall, the Gates Mills Library and the Gates Mills Post Office. A nominal entry fee per work is involved. Artistic entries will be accepted: April 9-11th, and judging results will be available April 13-14th.

The esteemed panel of judges decides which artistic works will be included in the show and which pieces will receive awards. The awards given are:

- Mo Novello Founder's Award: Best in Show \$1000
- First Place: \$800
- Second Place: \$600
- Third Place: \$400.
- 2024 Walter and Irene Oliver Memorial Award "The Natural
 - World": \$500
- 2024 Bob Santoro "Family Choice" Award: \$300.

A special award is the Paul A. Meunier Award. From all entries submitted, a special jury of two Gates Mills residents will select the work of art they feel best represents life in Gates Mills: \$500.

New residents, do not miss the Art Show's opening! It's an always entertaining Patrons' Party on Saturday evening where patrons are the first to view the art, see the award winning works and have an opportunity to purchase favorite pieces. Everyone will be there! And, on the following night, purchasers of art works are invited to meet and mingle with the artists at the Artists Party.

Heritage Home Program in Gates Mills

For many years now, the Village of Gates Mills has partnered with the Heritage Home Program. It is part of the well regarded **Cleveland Restoration Society**, a regional historic preservation HERITAGE HOME PROGRAM

organization. The Heritage Home Program offers no-cost, expert technical assistance for older homes built before 1974, and appraised at less than \$750,000. They also offer financing for renovations as low as 2%. This financing is not dependent on income. The owner of any home meeting the criteria of: 1) built before 1974, and 2) appraised at less than \$750,000 can apply. It is a non-governmental program. The mission of this program is historic preservation throughout Cuyahoga County.

Bennett-VanCuren Historic House Tour

Due to the Art Show, our April Luncheon will be held off site. We have arranged for a private, guided tour of the 13 beautifully restored rooms of the Bennett-VanCuren House which reflect the time period from 1805-1930. The Mayfield Township Historical Society is based in the home which was built in 1847. The tour involves climbing stairs.

The Society was formed in 1976 to preserve artifacts, documents, and other materials pertaining to the original Mayfield Township that was established in 1819. The Township broke up in the 1920's into the communities of Gates Mills, Highland Heights, Mayfield Heights, Mayfield Village, and the eastern portion of Lyndhurst. The Society continues to gather and preserve history from all four communities.

Attendees will enjoy a catered lunch after the tour which will be

held in the outdoor pavilion behind the house if weather permits.

From Your Police Department Welcome to Spring as it has officially arrived!

I want to highlight some of the duties and additional responsibilities of our full-time police officers. Much of what they do is above and beyond just responding to calls for service and basic patrol. This month I will present some of our full-time officers and their duties, and in May, I will highlight the remaining officers. Below are <u>some</u> of the responsibilities of our officers.

Lieutenant Michael Pollutro: 25-year member and second in command of the department. Duties include scheduling, public information officer, range supervisor, training coordinator, report reviewer, dayshift patrol support, etc.

Sergeant Randy Savage: 25-year member and the primary patrol sergeant of two shifts. Extra duties include: accident report statistician, off duty scheduling coordinator, auxiliary officer coordinator, yearly evaluations, etc.

Detective Sergeant Michael Day: 23-year member and shift overlap patrol sergeant. Extra duties include: the detective bureau, evidence collection, Lyndhurst Court Liaison, Village IT coordinator, etc.

Corporal John Richards: 22-year member. Duties include: Shift OIC, basic patrol, regional SWAT team member, vehicle maintenance officer, use of force instructor, etc.

Patrol Officer Angela Suchetka: 21-year member. Duties include: Shift OIC, basic patrol, First Aid/AED coordinator, Safety Town Instructor, Social Media coordinator, etc.

Patrol Officer Dylan Hustosky: 11-year member: Duties include: Shift OIC, basic patrol, Field Training Officer, Speed Sign data collection coordinator, accident investigator, etc.

It looks like Spring has arrived...

Recently I have been contacted by several residents asking about our central dispatch and how an emergency call is processed. Dispatch receives calls basically in two ways.

The first way is via phone. When you call 911 on your home landline, your address comes up automatically on the dispatcher's screen. The dispatcher then begins to take the emergency information necessary to send the most appropriate help such as Police, Fire, or Emergency Medical Services. If you call from your cell phone, the call is routed from the nearest cell tower to an established communications center, most likely CECOMS in Cuyahoga County. Although the dispatcher will have your cell phone number, they will not know your physical location. It is important to answer all the dispatcher's questions and never hang up until told to do so by the dispatcher. Unfortunately, cell phone reports take longer to process because it adds an extra call from one dispatch center (CECOMS) to our central dispatch center (Chagrin Valley Dispatch). However, if you dial 1-440-423-4456 from either a landline or cell phone you can reach Chagrin Valley Dispatch directly.

The second way the dispatch center receives emergency calls is via an alarm company (monitored alarm system). When a smoke alarm, heat alarm, medical alarm, etc. is received at the alarm company, they will notify the prescribed dispatch center for further processing and emergency response. Not all homes have a monitored alarm system, so if there is an alarm, a phone call to Dispatch will be necessary to get an emergency response initiated. We hope that more homes will consider monitored alarms to better protect lives and property at any given hour of the day.

Additionally, did you know that the Village Police Department has a key file system? A resident can choose to keep a house key in the Police Department's secure safe. This allows Safety Forces to enter a home during an emergency without creating undue physical damage to the home. Drop a key off at the Police Department if you'd like to participate.

Gates Mills as Bird Sanctuary

Gates Mills has a long history of being bird friendly. One of our Village's early prominent residents was Samuel Prentiss Baldwin. Among his many accomplishments, Baldwin was a respected ornithologist who devoted the last twenty-five years of his life to the study of birds. Baldwin was born in Cleveland in 1868, earned an undergraduate and Master's degree in geology from Dartmouth, and a law degree from Western Reserve Law School in 1894. He married Lilian Converse Hanna in 1898, and they divided their time between their homes in Wade Park and Gates Mills. Their country home was Hillcrest Farm, the Baldwin Estate, which today stands at the top of Old Mill Road near Cardinal Lane.

Baldwin's major contributions to ornithology were the development of modern bird banding techniques and the use of the subsequent gathered information banding provided. By the end of 1937, he had banded over 20,000 birds belonging to 80 species. Ultimately, Baldwin and his assistants banded thousands more birds and trapped adult birds as well as nestlings both in the Village and in Thomasville, Georgia. Once individual birds could be identified by their bands, Baldwin did extensive studies of their habits. The little house wren was assiduously studied and documented in ornithological journals for his peers.

Thanks to the Garden Club's efforts in the 1960's, the Village is a designated bird sanctuary, and signs stating that fact are posted at all entrances to the Village. Additionally, be sure to look for the Bird Walks schedule in the April and May Pink Sheets. Walks are planned for early Sunday mornings, and all are welcome.

This suggests a long-standing affinity for our avian neighbors who most assuredly appreciate being on the receiving end of our respect and care. Our thoughtful efforts on their behalf are appreciated. Accordingly, a small reminder: it is time to clean out bluebird houses and other nesting bird boxes. Our feathered friends like a fresh start come spring as do we all.

Speaking of fresh starts for our feathered residents, it's been about five years since the Service Department surprised residents by building and hanging birdhouses around the Village. Nothing lasts forever and accordingly, Ted Zalewski and John Pata of the Service Department created about 40 new birdhouses of various sizes and designs and installed them around the Village. Hopefully screech owls, barred owls, woodpeckers, titmice, sparrows, bluebirds and chickadees will be encouraged to settle here.






"We do various projects from year to year to help maintain Village history and to provide enjoyment for villagers," said Ted.

John added, "We hope to encourage residents to add some birdhouses to their own properties." Some birdhouses have metal roofs, and others have perches made of branches to add more living space for the tenants. The exteriors are natural wood.

The road map of the Village indicates where bird houses are and the locations are listed in the chart. As you wander the Village, check off which birdhouses you notice. It's an avian inspired treasure hunt for we humans. A chart with the latitude and longitude of each is on our website.

Gates Mills Land Conservancy

Preserve Protect Together
April 2024

In December of 2002 Daniel and Lorinda Collister donated a Conservation Easement to the Gates Mills Land Conservancy, protecting the significant habitat and scenic area of their property along the Chagrin River.

The "Collister" property consists of roughly 23 acres of open spaces and forested habitat located on a residential parcel with one existing home and associated outbuildings. This property off of Rogers Road, also abuts another 26-acre parcel protected by the Land Conservancy. The entire 49 acres border the Chagrin River and protect over one-half mile of riverbank, as well as drainage along that scenic waterway.

The importance of the Collister Conservation Easement is that this natural forest and open meadow habitat is bordering the Chagrin River, which has been designated a State Scenic River by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources. Dan and Rindy Collister, founding stewards of Gates Mills Land Conservancy, understood the value of such a gift to the longtime preservation of our natural resources and the beauty of Gates Mills Village. When they sold their property in 2011 to David Van Curen, they had confidence in the continuation of this good stewardship.

David has a positive view of the conservation easement as well, "Having a property with a conservation easement didn't change anything in my decision-making process to purchase it. The very attractive part of conservation easements is that the property will stay the way it is forever. I would definitely consider placing a conservation easement on other properties I'd be interested in purchasing."

The Collister Conservation Easement, as most easements, maintains a portion of the property, described as a footprint, for the owner to manage without restrictions. The remainder of acreage, outside of the footprint, is protected in perpetuity by the specific restrictions described in the conservation easement. Thus, permanent protection of the scenic habitat is ensured.

Over the years, many property owners have chosen to preserve their land by making provision for either no or limited development. Among the two most common practices to achieve this are donation of the property to a land trust or a conservation easement. In its role as steward for the protection of our local open spaces, the Gates Mills Land Conservancy is available to discuss and assist any landowners who are interested in preserving their property.





WE HAVE LOST SOME DEAR FRIENDS



EMILY WILSON, 74, of Gates Mills, Ohio, passed away on February 15, 2024. She leaves behind a sister, Susanne (Susie) Erikson and a brother Samuel (Sam) Wilson, along with nephews and a niece, McClure Erikson, Ralph Maier, David Maier and Elizabeth Maier. She also leaves behind her beloved lab Pinky. She was predeceased by her parents John McClure Wilson and Patricia Wellman Wilson as well as her sister Eva Wilson Maier.

Emily grew up in Aurora, Ohio and was a graduate of Laurel School in Shaker Heights, class of 1967. She often commented that Laurel School was an enriching experience that impacted her life, not just academically. She attended Pomona College in California and received her BA from the University of Pittsburgh and an MA in English from Carnegie-Mellon University. Afterwards, she taught English and creative writing at Pitt.

Later, her life and career took a very different turn. The call of the outdoors, always there, took her out of the realm of academia, but never away from her love of teaching. Ultimately the love of fly fishing lead her to a life as an outdoorswoman. In her words: "Fly fishing was not simply a business. It was a sustaining passion and a business. Starting in those early years, fly fishing, the love and practice of it, was what ultimately took me the longest way round to the shortest way home. I didn't know it then. What I thought was that I had finally found freedom in wildness." Emily was an instructor in all things fly fishing, as well as a guide and owner of the fly shop, Yellow Breeches Outfitters.

After many years of owning Yellow Breeches Outfitters in Boiling Springs, PA, Emily left the business side of fly fishing, but remained avidly connected to the joy of it, the "lure" of being on the water. Eventually another sporting realm beckoned her, field trials. Throughout the years Emily was never without a dog by her side. Her firm but kind and compassionate training could take an unmanageable beast and turn it into a calm, well behaved friend. That ability to train, communicate and connect with her dogs drew her into the sphere of field trial, mainly in Thomasville, Georgia. In short, field trial is an event where dogs, mostly retrievers, are judged on their style, marking, ability to take directions and retrieving to hand, and when not retrieving, are expected to remain quietly by their handler's side watching the other dogs work. Her labs had success in quite a few events.

After her years of living in Thomasville, Emily returned to a place near and dear to her, Gates Mills, Ohio; a place where she could fish and enjoy the beautiful Chagrin River valley. There she reconnected with Laurel classmates, found a wonderful book club in the Tremont area, attended Pilgrim Congregational Church, took up photography, pickleball and never stopped exploring the world around her. She always found new things to pique her ever present curiosity and shared that passion with her friends. She was kind, courageous and compassionate. We were so lucky to have had her in our lives.

Until her death, Emily was vice president and trustee of the S. K. Wellman Foundation, and moved forward its mission to promote culture and education as well as help those in need in the Cleveland area.

ERIC HOWARD CARMEN was a singer and songwriter whose death was announced on March 11, 2024. Eric was born on August 11, 1949, to Ruth and Elmer Carmen in Cleveland. He is survived by his former wife, Susan Brown and their children, Clayton and Kathryn; his current wife Amy Murphy, and a brother, Fred. Eric lived in Beachwood before moving to the West Coast and then returned to Gates Mills in the 1990s. A few years ago Eric moved to Arizona.

Eric grew up in Lyndhurst, Ohio, and played music from an early age. He attended the Dalcroze Eurhythmics program at the Cleveland Institute of Music at just three years old, studied the violin at six, and was writing his own songs by his teens. Eric was a 1967 graduate of Brush High School and attended John Carroll University, where he met the



group that would become the Raspberries. Formed in 1970, Carmen provided vocals and wrote the band's songs, using a pop-infused brand of rock now called "power pop." Until their breakup in 1975, the Raspberries scored hits with songs like "Go All the Way," "I Wanna Be with You," and "Overnight Sensation (Hit Record)."

His final song was "Brand New Year," released in 2013.

- Create and Practice Your Plan: Pick a safe room such as a basement, storm cellar, or an interior room on the lowest floor with no windows

During a...

- Stay Weather-Ready: Continue to listen to local news or a NDAA Weather Radio
- At Your House: If in a tornado warning go to your safe room. Don't forget pets if time allows
- At Work/School: Proceed to your tornado shelter location quickly and calmly. Stay away from windows and do not go to large open rooms such as cafeterias, gyms, or auditoriums

- Help Your Neighbor: If you come across people that are injured and you are properly trained, provide first aid to victims if needed until emergency response teams arrive
