Greetings from the Fire Department! As this is my first article in the Pink Sheet, I wanted to introduce myself and provide some fire safety information as well. I have been in the fire service for 49 years. I started as a part-time firefighter in Willoughby Hills in 1974 and became full-time with the Cleveland Hopkins Airport Fire Department in 1976 and transferred to Pepper Pike Fire Dept in 1981. In 1995, I was hired as a training officer for the Gates Mills Fire Department. In 2003 I became the Assistant Fire Chief. I currently hold State of Ohio Licenses in Firefighter II, Fire Safety Inspector, Fire Instructor, Live Fire Instructor, Paramedic, and graduate of Lakeland Community College, Associate in Fire Science.

Our Fire Department had a record number of calls (42) for the month of August. This included storm duty calls and a working house fire. I would like to thank my fellow firefighters for their prompt response and diligence in handling all these calls.

The August storm impacted many areas in northeastern Ohio, and Gates Mills had widespread damage in many areas of the Village. With so many trees down and entangled in power lines, many areas were without power for an extended period. Firefighters and Service Department members moved many branches and trees to open as many roadways as possible. It is important to note that it is never safe for anyone to move downed power lines without the lines being checked by a member of the power company. Many times, lines will energize objects they touch or even the ground around the wire. The Fire Department will use banner tape and traffic cones to create a warning area to keep workers and the public safe.

This event should prompt all to have a family disaster plan and the supplies to provide for these emergencies at hand. The Federal Emergency Management Agency recommends that necessary supplies should be stockpiled for an emergency lasting three to seven days.

October is Fire Prevention Month. Check your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors!

#### **From Your Police Department:**

Fall is upon us! I hope that you were able to enjoy and make the most of your summer.

October is National Crime Prevention Month. Most homes in the village are protected with a security system. It may be a good time to contact your provider and re-evaluate your system as technology constantly changes and improves. If you are not signed up to receive emergency notifications, please consider doing so. The notifications allow us to alert you with important information we feel needs to be shared immediately. To sign up go to our webpage gatesmillsvillage.com and click on the Ready Notify tab on the right-hand side. If you need assistance, Town Hall Coordinator Jean Misch can assist you, please contact her at the village hall 440-423-4405 ext. 111.

The police department is encouraging residents who have cameras around their property to notify us so we can add you out our database registry. Having this information can be beneficial to us in the event we are investigating criminal activity in the area. I also want to remind residents that Crime Prevention Officer, Jessica Newsome, is available to meet with you and provide you with safety tips for your residence. Ptl. Newsome can be reached at 423-4405 ext. 132 or at jnewsomegatesmillsvillage.com.

This month Corporal John Richards will be completing 21 years of service in the police department. John is assigned to our regional SWAT Team. Cpl. Richards has been one of the two snipers on the Unit for seven years. He also serves as a shift Officer-In-Charge and the department's Vehicle Maintenance Officer. He works closely with our village fleet mechanic, Armando, to make sure the patrol cars are safe for our patrol officers. Congratulations to Corporal Richards on this dedication and service to the village.

Our Mayfield Road speed camera program has been a very effective tool for us. Through the first two months, excessive motorists driving over 60mph has been reduced by approximately 60%. A reminder the speed cameras are an addition to traditional traffic enforcement by our patrol officers. Our current data shows about 16,000 motorists travel on Mayfield Road each day and we are targeting about the 2% of drivers.

And finally, our Halloween event will be on Friday, October 27<sup>th</sup> at the Community House.

#### The Bridge

Written by Sterling W. Hubbard, Jr. on the occasion of its restoration, October, 1980

The second in a series of articles on the Walking Bridge in the Village

There is an iron bridge across the Chagrin in the middle of the Village. It misses St. Christopher-by-the-River by feet. A family of mallards lives under the bridge with an adopted Muscovy duck who returns with them every summer. They build nests in the spaces between the rusting iron and the large stone footings which parallel the river bank. The bridge crosses the river at an acute angle. Its floor is a parallelogram ten feet above the water conforming to the right-of-way angle. The angle carries up into the tall structure and is augmented by an assortment of angles greater and smaller.

The bridge was assembled with red hot rivets before the turn of the century. It was built for the Cleveland and Eastern Railroad Company which went quietly out of business in nineteen twenty-six, as did most of the other electric interurbans. The tracks were sold for scrap and the brick power house and car barn on the east bank abandoned. The bricks later became the walls of the new town hall and the bridge was left for a footpath between the two halves of the village.

The contractor who built the line was paid by the mile. The right-of-way still shows it. It wanders. There was, however, one straight section of track about eighteen miles long, running into the city. It paralleled the old plank toll road which the electric line bought.

One morning early, leaning on the south handrails of the bridge, I was watching six Canada geese cruising single file downriver toward me. Sam Cahill was opening his grocery store on the east bank. He saw me on the bridge and hollered, "Good morning!"

"Hey, Sam," I hello'd back, "come over here and look at the gaggle of geese I've got for you."

He joined me and we watched their crisscrossing of the river as they sailed down on us.

"Don't seem to be eating," I noted.

Who could see to eat in that muck," said Sam. "And who would eat it if they could see it?"

The water was a bit on the brown side.

"You know, Sam, it's hard for me to imagine you at the controls of those big interurbans thundering over this bridge."

"Thundering?" Sam looked up. "Not on this bridge. We came through here dead slow. There was stop twenty-one over there by the old Maple Leaf Inn on the west bank, and we stopped again over here on the east bank by the dispatcher's office. Where the Red Fox is. We braked all the way down the east hill, and all the way down the west hill. Those hills were steep."

Sam and I crossed to the north railing of the bridge to watch the geese slide under, but they got sidetracked in the glide past the mallards' domain. The owners were not in residence.

"Thunder across the bridge," reminisced Sam. "Yes, there was thunder once, come to think of it. I was a dispatcher at the time. It was a Sunday morning. A loaded coal car rolled out of a siding at Scotland Corners. It coasted through the meadows of the White place, picking up speed as it went. I was in the dispatcher's office even though I wasn't expecting anything until noon. It must have been about half past ten when I heard something tearing down the east hill and roaring over the trestle up in Echo Glen. I looked up the track and here comes this coal car down on me like a mad bull. I was paralyzed."

"What did you do?"

"Do? What could I do? Put my foot on the track and derail the damned coal car? I didn't have any time anyway, and thank God there wasn't anything coming the other way. So...it was sort of let the cat die. Coast up one hill, stop, then back down again and up the other hill, roaring over the bridge each time. I thought maybe we could stop it with some two-by-fours when it reversed on our hill."

"Did you catch it?"

"Nope, said Sam. "Never came back."

"Oh come on now, Sam."

"It was kind of a noble sacrifice on the part of Fritz Walker\*. Not that he intended it that way. Listen. I've got to open up. Come on, I'll buy you a coffee."

We started off the bridge, looking occasionally at the geese downstream. At the end of the bridge Sam turned and looked back at the church. "It was Sunday, as I said, and we had a visiting preacher that day. I wasn't in church. I heard about it later. George Brown told me it was the shortest service he could remember. The visiting clergyman had raised his hand and was about to speak when there was this deafening roar and the whole church shook. The minister's raised had stayed aloft and his mouth stayed open. The knuckles of his other hand whitened on the side of the lectern. His eyes wandered around the church. #### **Gates Mills Land Conservancy**

October 2023

On Saturday September 16<sup>th</sup> the Gates Mills Land Conservancy hosted our first Seminar entitled, "Preserving Gates Mills – Uniting for Land, Water and Tree Preservation". Our three speakers, Dr. Roy Larick - Bluestone Conservation, Chad Clink – Bartlett Tree, and Heather Elmer - Chagrin River Watershed Partners presented in-depth lectures regarding the development of the Chagrin River and identified key environmental issues and solutions for proper stewardship of the land, water and trees.

Along with these key partners, the Gates Mills Land Conservancy's vision is to preserve the natural beauty of the land on both sides of the Chagrin River and to attempt to minimize development through conservation easements and riparian setbacks. One seventh of the Chagrin River's 51-mile length passes through our community. The Gates Mills portion of this watershed is a 175-square-mile network of tributaries, which collect and transfer this runoff to the river as it travels through our village.

Unique issues related to the preservation of the River Corridor include the significant annual erosion of the riverbanks. This may be due to shifting of the riverbank throughout the year from the powerful forces of the Chagrin River or can be the result of development activity in close proximity to these banks. These changes damage riparian areas, the naturally vegetated hillsides, meadows and marches, and additionally affect animal, bird and fish populations living in those riparian areas. Establishing wider riparian setbacks and planting trees and special vegetation native to the river, helps to stabilize stream banks, limits erosion, reduces flood size flows and/or filter and settle out runoff pollutants.

Gates Mills is an integral part of the larger geographical landscape and a major contributor of the Chagrin River Watershed. Because it passes through so many communities, it is understandable that both the Chagrin River and Lake Erie are extremely vulnerable to manmade and natural disasters. One of the best ways to protect the Chagrin River Watershed is to maintain open space, including riparian setbacks, along the banks of the river and its tributaries.

Over the years, many property owners have chosen to preserve their land by making provision for either no or limited development. Among the most common practices are land donation and conservation easements. In its role as steward for the protection of our local open spaces, the Gates Mills Land Conservancy is available to discuss and assist any landowners who are interested in preserving their property.

We take our stewardship responsibility seriously, so we hope that you will reach out to us with your riparian questions, and that you will consider a long-term preservation plan for your property as well.

#### **Meet Mayfield Middle School**

As our local public school children complete Gates Mills Elementary School, the next stop is the **Mayfield Middle School** serving 1,000 students in grades six to eight. As we kickoff the 2023-2024 school year, we wanted to share a few ABC-oriented data points on the things to love about our Mayfield Middle School!

**Awards** – The Association for Middle School Education identified Mayfield Middle School as a school of distinction – the only Ohio School selected and one of eleven schools across the country receiving this honor in 2023! Additionally, our Principal, Paul Destino was named 2022 Educator of the Year by the Ohio Middle School Association.

**Balanced team structure** – Students at the middle school are divided into grade-level teams of approximately 100 students. Each team of students attends core classes together, allowing for strong relationships to be built among students and teachers during the school year. There are approximately 26 students in each classroom.

Challenging curriculum – Mayfield Middle School utilizes a variety of both standardized and informal measures to determine where each student is on the learning spectrum so that true personalization can be met in the curriculum. Students are empowered to oversee their own authentic and engaging education and can participate in numerous elective course options like ceramics, robotics, videography, and podcasting, giving them the opportunity to make connections between their areas of interest and learning in the classroom. Communication goals and opportunities to participate in student led debates, Socratic seminars, and other strategies enable students to be comfortable speaking in public to both their peers and adults.

**Diverse enrollment** – Our student body is diverse, with 58% of students identified as White, 21% Black, 8% Asian or Pacific Islander, 7% Hispanic, and 6% Multiracial.

**Engaging and exciting clubs to join** – Students have the opportunity to expand their horizons by joining social clubs in middle school including Crochet Club, Science Club, Art Club, Harry Potter Lunch Bunch, National History Day Club, Homework Club, Photography Club, Power of the Pen, Student Council, Model United Nations, Lego Robotics, Morning Rec Clubs, Library Lunch Bunch and Morning Band Club.

**Fun volunteer opportunities** – Our students are learning the importance of community service and being good citizens. Mayfield Middle School (MMS) Day of Service is a way to teach our students the importance of giving back to our community and to look for ways to lend a hand to others. In past years, the students at MMS spent half the day raking lawns to help community members, and the other half of the day working on a variety of projects. The projects included, writing letters to soldiers overseas, making treats for dogs and cats in animal shelters, visiting a local nursing home to play games with residents, creating gift bags for kids staying in the hospital and other service-related activities.






